A Note About Forms

Bloomington Pediatrics is happy to complete forms for families that are required by schools and daycares. While most forms can be completed while you are here for your appointment, here are a few things to keep in mind if you call for a form:

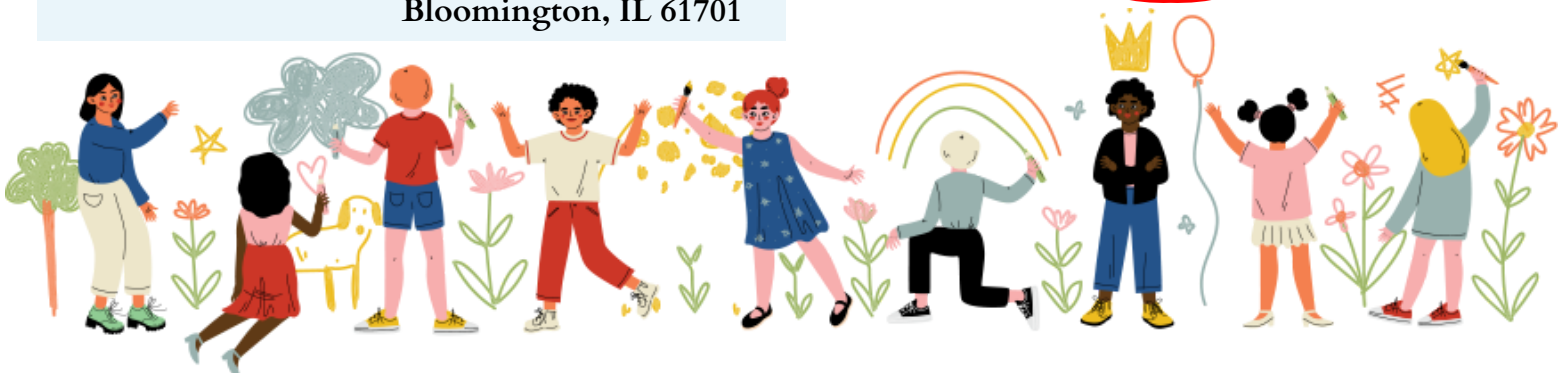
1. Please allow 2 business days to complete your form request. On occasion, it may take longer if your provider is not in the office.
2. Parents are required to complete the "parent sections" of forms regarding patient demographic data, insurance, etc. Our nursing staff and providers will take care of the "medical sections."
3. Completed forms may be picked up in person (valid photo ID required), sent via the patient portal, or snail-mailed. We are not able to email forms, nor are we able to fax them to schools or daycares

*Pro-Tip: Ask for your completed form to be sent to you through the patient portal so you may print a new copy as needed!

What's Included in a Well Visit?

The providers of Bloomington Pediatrics pride themselves on offering a comprehensive exam at each of your child's routine well visits. These appointments provide the best opportunity for the provider to observe the progress of your child's physical and mental growth and development, to provide counseling and education to parents and caregivers, to detect potential concerns through physical examination and screening tests, provide immunizations, and develop the provider-patient-parent relationship! This is also the ideal time for parents to raise questions and concerns about their child's development, behavior, nutrition, safety, and overall well-being.

Please note that while most well-child preventative care is covered, some services may not be included in that coverage for your plan. Please check with your insurance company for detailed coverage information. Our billing department is available to meet with you to answer any questions you have about specific services.



Below are the typical services you may see on the charges submitted to your insurance company. Many services are age/child-specific, so you won't see them every time.

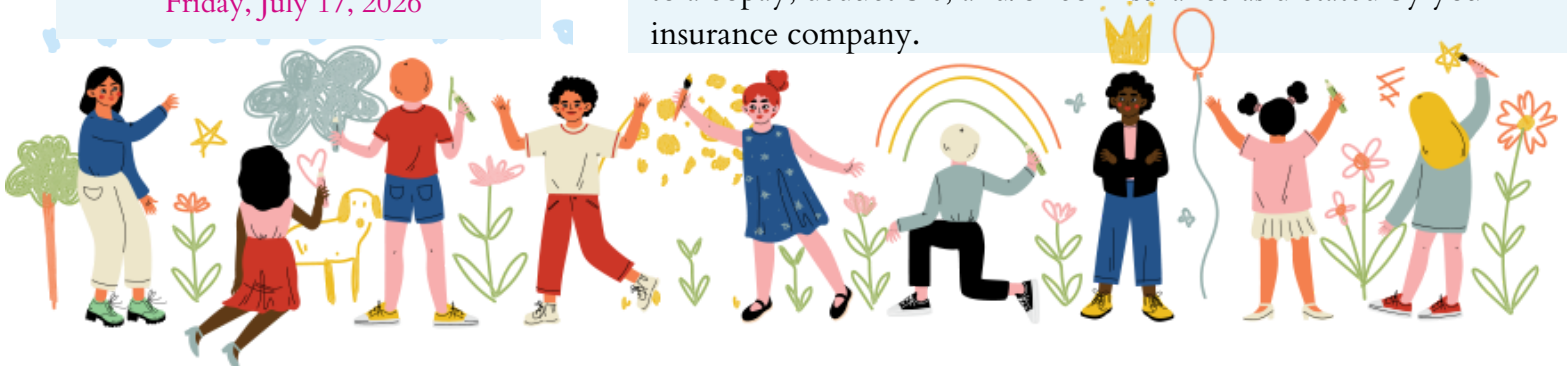
- Well child physical exam
- Developmental screening
- Vision screening
- Health risk assessment
- Screening lab tests
- Emotional/behavioral screening
- Sports health screening
- Immunizations

We understand that sometimes health concerns unrelated to well care can come up during a well-child visit. Our providers are happy to address those concerns while you are here, as their schedule allows. Complex issues, such as new mental health concerns, may need more time than the scheduled well visit allows and require an additional appointment to address adequately. Please note that concerns outside the scope of a well-child visit may be billed an additional office visit charge, which would be subject to a copay, deductible, and/or co-insurance as dictated by your insurance company.

Summer Safety Tips



Summer is officially here, which means more time outdoors for our kiddos! Here are a few quick tips for a safe summer!

- Protect your littles from sunburn. Keep babies 6 months and under in the shade and dress them in lightweight clothing that covers their arms and legs, as well as a brimmed hat to protect their face and neck. For older children, play in the shade as much as possible, limit sun exposure during the midday peak intensity, and use a good SPF30 or higher broad-spectrum sunscreen and reapply often!
- Water play is a great way to cool down on a hot day. Keep your littles within arm's reach when you are near water. Swim lessons are a great way to start teaching your toddler about water safety. If you have a pool, be sure that it has a fence and lockable gate. Baby pools should be emptied when not in use for further safety.
- With the summer heat comes all the summer bugs! To help prevent bug bites, avoid areas where bugs may be prevalent, such as standing water and flowerbeds. Dressing your child in lightweight clothing that covers their arms and legs, as well as a brimmed hat can also help keep insects away. When selecting an insect repellent, the American Academy of Pediatrics and the CDC recommend using one registered with the EPA (Environmental Protection Agency).
